ATTENTION YOUTH DAIRY GOAT AND YOUTH POULTRY/WATERFOWL EXHIBITORS

So that The Bolton Fair has animals for the fairgoers to see on Friday and Sunday when there isn't a show, we are looking for Youth Exhibitors to bring their animals for exhibit on Friday and/or Sunday.

Exhibitors must be willing to make a commitment based on the following rules -

- 1. Animals must be entered in their respective animal show.
- 2. Animals must be checked in and setup before Friday 11:00AM and Sunday before 8:00AM.
- 3. Animals may be removed after 6:00PM.
- 4. Animals must have food and water, supplied by Exhibitor.
- 5. Food must be marked with Exhibitor's name.
- 6. Exhibitors must remain on the fairgrounds.
- 7. Exhibitors and their animals are welcome to stay overnight on Friday and/or Saturday.
- 8. Exhibitors will be compensated for their time and effort.

If interested, note on your entry form the day(s) you want to exhibit your animals and we will get in touch with you to discuss more details.

GENERAL RULES FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS



PLEASE READ ALL RULES CAREFULLY.

CHANGES and ADDITIONS HAVE BEEN MADE!

Before submitting your entry forms, each Exhibitor/Guardian is responsible for reading and understanding the following rules:

- Current Bolton Fair General Rules for Livestock Exhibitors, Pages 2-6
- Current MA Animal Health Rules for Fairs and Shows, Pages 7-11
- Current participating Animal Show Rules, beginning on Page 13

The rules and regulations contained in The Bolton Fair Livestock Exhibitor Guide are the conditions under which all entries are accepted. A signed 2024 Bolton Fair Entry Form serves as an agreement to comply with all rules and regulations contained within this book and all other official Bolton Fair publications (including changes posted within our website).

ATTENTION ALL EXHIBITORS Entry and Parking Information

NOTE: Parking on the fairgrounds is only for trucks/trailers and cars that are transporting animals participating in the shows. Vehicles carrying tack, equipment, tents, etc. will unload and park across the street. Parking passes will be given for both parking areas.

- 1. Each Exhibitor over 18, in their vehicle with their animal(s), gets free entry into the Fair.
- 2. If Exhibitor is under 18, the Exhibitor and one parent/guardian in their vehicle, with their animals, get free entry into the Fair.

On all 2024 Bolton Fair Entry Forms, the following information is requested:

- 1. Number of Vehicles Entering Fairgrounds and what day
- 2. Number of Exhibitors/Passengers in Each Vehicle for each day
- 3. If you are traveling in another Bolton Fair Exhibitor's vehicle, please make sure you include this information on your entry form.

Please complete ALL information.

Based on the information you provide to us, we will mail to you a Parking Pass that hangs on your rear view mirror; it will include the number of exhibitors/passengers and vehicles that will be allowed free entry, and the parking lot area. If there are more passengers in your vehicle than posted on your Parking Pass, those individuals must pay to enter the fairgrounds.

Remember your Parking Pass - - No Parking Pass, No Fairgrounds Entry with your vehicle

ALL EXHIBITORS PLEASE READ

- 1. Livestock Shows include Youth Beef and Dairy Cattle, Youth and Open Sheep, Youth Dairy Goat, Youth Poultry and Waterfowl, Youth and Open Rabbit and Youth Swine.
- 2. All livestock must be owned by the Exhibitor or leased. Exhibitor must bring proof of ownership/lease agreement for each animal shown. Refer to the individual animal show rules for specific information.
- 3. The Exhibitor listed on the Entry Form must be the person who shows the animal(s) listed on the Entry Form.
- 4. Registration papers are to be made available at the time of check in and for the duration of the Fair.
- 5. Owners, Exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by Fair or Livestock Committee.
- 6. 2024 Massachusetts Fair Animal Health Rules are conditions for entry into The Bolton Fair. The State Veterinarian or Livestock Committee MUST check all animals on arrival at the Fairgrounds before penning.
- 7. All animals entered must be in good health and in proper physical condition and will be examined at the exhibition. Any animals showing evidence of poor condition or infectious or contagious disease will be required to leave the fairgrounds immediately. The Livestock Committee and/or State Veterinarian's decision is final.
- 8. The Livestock and Fair Committees and Judges reserve the right to reject any or all animals/exhibits they deem are not desirable or properly entered.
- 9. The Judge/Livestock Committee reserves the right to combine or split classes based on the number of entries entered in the class.
- 10. In all questions, the decision of the Judge is final.
- 11. All Exhibitors will be under the direction of the Livestock Committee and they will exercise every reasonable care in the protection of exhibits, but in no case will the Livestock Committee or The Bolton Fair be responsible for any loss or damage by or arising from any animal or exhibit; and to defend and indemnify The Bolton Fair and the Directors thereof against all claims and liability in regard thereto. Upon this condition only are entries accepted.
- 12. The Bolton Fair is an educational activity. Exhibitors are expected to exercise good sportsmanship, cooperation, and honesty and have a positive social behavior towards others. Their conduct shall always reflect the highest standard of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education.
- 13. Exhibitors may sell, after judging, only animals/exhibits entered in The Bolton Fair, with the permission of the Livestock or Bolton Fair Committee. The animals/exhibits must remain on the fairgrounds until 6:00PM. If this regulation is not met, the Exhibitor may be asked to leave the fairgrounds and will not receive any premiums earned.
- 14. The Bolton Fair will not be responsible for any animals bought and sold at any show.
- 15. The Bolton Fair Committee reserves the right to ask any Exhibitor to leave the fairgrounds if any infraction of the rules is not followed.

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ALL EXHIBITORS

PLEASE READ

- 16. Additional rules for each animal show are listed on the following pages. *Please read carefully*.
- 17. All individual animal show rules override the General Rules for Livestock Exhibitors.
- 18. Overnight parking is first come, first served. If you are planning on staying overnight on the fairgrounds, please note on your entry form when you will be setting up your tent/rv. Please be respectful of your neighbors. Quiet hours are 10:00 pm 6:00 am. This includes generators and loud music.
- 19. Because of our concern for the safety of the animals on exhibit and for the comfort and safety of our patrons,
 - NO PETS ARE ALLOWED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS OR TO REMAIN IN YOUR CAR, with the only exception being a service animal, with their documentation, trained to provide assistance to an individual with a disability.
- 20. <u>For everyone's safety, all tents that are set up by exhibitors and their families must be securely weighed down at each corner. If they are not secured, you will be asked to take them down.</u>
- 21. Please be advised that in the evening fairgoers may be walking through the animal show area to see the animals.
- 22. The Bolton Fair funds the premiums. Premiums will be mailed to winners.

YOUTH EXHIBITORS

PLEASE READ

1. Youth Exhibitors and Handlers are required to wear clean white shirts or 4-H T-shirts with white or tan pants and suitable shoes. No shorts, bathing suits, sandals or bare feet will be allowed. This is a State Requirement for participation and premium eligibility.

Note: The Youth Beef Show requires a western shirt and black pants.

- 2. Youth Exhibitors are for young people under 18 years of age as of January 1st of current year.

 Youth Swine Show. Additional class: Young Adult (Age 21 25)
- 3. Youth Exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at The Bolton Fair, without assistance from family and friends. The classes will be judged on fitting and conditioning of the animal, training and handling of the animal, showmanship methods used and the Exhibitor's appearance and conduct in the ring. Animals must also be shown in the breed class.
- 4. Overnight policy: Youth Exhibitors are welcome to stay overnight, with adult supervision.
- 5. Parents are responsible for supervision of Youth Exhibitors. Safety, appropriate 4H behavior, and respectful care of the fairgrounds are expected of each Exhibitor.
- 6. Check out and participate in the fun events listed on page 13.

ENTRY FORM INSTRUCTIONS

PLEASE READ

In order for the Entry Form to be accepted, each Exhibitor must:

- 1. Use only 2024 Bolton Fair Entry Forms.
- 2. Use a separate 2024 Bolton Fair Entry Form for each show. Entry forms may be copied, if necessary.
- 3. Complete ALL information requested on Entry Form.
- 4. Sign and date the Entry Form.
- 5. Include Entry Fee(s) with Entry Form(s). See Individual Animal Show Rules and Entry Forms for entry fee amounts.
- 6. Mail 2024 Bolton Fair Entry Forms and entry fees to **THE BOLTON FAIR, INC.**, **PO BOX 154**, **BOLTON, MA 01740**.
- 7. Entries will be reviewed in the chronological order (of the postmarked date) they were received.
- 8. Entries will be accepted as space permits. Entries received after that time will be returned.
- Entry deadline is July 12. ENTRIES POSTMARKED OR RECEIVED AFTER JULY 12 WILL INCUR A LATE FEE <u>FOR EACH ANIMAL</u> ENTERED and will only be accepted as space permits. See Individual Animal Show Rules for late fee amounts.
- 10. Incomplete and/or unsigned entries may be returned with any accompanying fees and may result in late entries, thus incurring late entry fees.

ENTRY AND DEPARTURE INFORMATION PLEASE READ

- 1. Livestock Exhibitors enter at Gate 1 for access to their animal show area.
- 2. **Friday, August 9**: All animals must be penned and vehicles removed by 11:00AM from the animal show area to the proper parking area. The Fair opens at Noon.
- 3. **Saturday and Sunday, August 10 + 11**: All animals must be penned and vehicles removed by 8:00AM from the animal show area to the designated area on the parking pass. The Fair opens at 9:00AM.
- 4. Departure time each day is 6:00PM. Exhibitors are expected to remain in the animal show exhibit with their animals until then. Loading begins at 6:00PM, no sooner.
- 5. Vehicles will be allowed onto the fairgrounds for loading and trucks/trailers will be allowed to move to the pole barns/tents for loading at 6:00PM. No sooner.
- 6. Before departing the Fairgrounds, each Exhibitor is responsible for cleaning up their respective area and moving soiled bedding to the designated manure piles. Wheelbarrows and pitchforks will be provided.
- 7. At the close of the Fair every day, each Exhibitor is expected to help the Livestock Committee/Chair break down pens and clean up their surroundings.
- 8. Premiums will be forfeited for any Exhibitor who chooses not to follow these regulations.


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EXHIBIT AREA INFORMATION

PLEASE READ

- 1. Livestock Exhibitors will be required to maintain their respective areas in a clean and orderly condition at all times.
- 2. Dirty, sick or unruly animals will not be permitted to compete and will be sent home at the Livestock Committee and/or Judge's discretion.
- 3. Each Exhibitor shall furnish feed, hay, and water containers. Water is available on the fairgrounds.
- 4. Exhibitors must provide own bedding.
- 5. Each Exhibitor is welcome to decorate his/her space to make the barn more appealing and educational.
- 6. At the close of the Fair every day, each Exhibitor is requested to help the Livestock Committee/Chair break down the pens and/or clean up their surroundings.
- 7. Premiums will be forfeited for any Exhibitor who chooses not to follow this regulation.

2024 ANIMAL HEALTH RULES FOR FAIRS AND SHOWS

IMPORTANT: Please see attached updated 2024 Animal Health Regulations below

These are subject to change and will be updated as needed.

Special Notes:

Due to the continuing outbreak of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in birds in the United States, Animal Health Officials from all six New England States may recommend postponing competitions, exhibitions, shows, swaps, or other in-person events encouraging the gathering or comingling of domestic fowl or poultry. If events are held, best practices for biosecurity should be implemented.

The virus that causes HPAI in birds, H5N1 influenza, has also been detected in lactating dairy cattle in 12 states as of May 24, 2024, all outside of New England. As a precaution, all lactating dairy cattle moving interstate are subject to additional pre-movement testing and documentation requirements, and some fairs and shows may prohibit their entry onto show grounds. Please see the "Cattle" section below for more information.

In the "Cattle" section--

Please be advised that the above guidance does not apply to Lactating Dairy Cattle moving interstate for purpose of showing or exhibition. Lactating Dairy Cattle are subject to the Federal Order requiring a negative test for Avian Influenza and an Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) written by an accredited veterinarian in the state of origin within 7 days of movement.

This is an evolving situation. Changes to these requirements will be published as they become available. Fairs and shows may elect to prohibit lactating dairy cattle from entering the show premises.

Special Note: Due to the continuing US outbreak of High Path Avian Influenza (HPAI), Animal Health Officials from all six New England States may recommend postponing competitions, exhibitions, shows, swaps, or other in-person events encouraging the gathering or comingling of domestic fowl or poultry. If events are held, best practices for biosecurity should be implemented.

In addition to complying with all laws and regulations governing animal health issues all fairs must adopt and enforce the following rules for governance for the fair.

NO animal will be admitted to the fairgrounds unless it meets the requirements below. NO animal is to be unloaded or enter a barn or tie-out stall until the animal and its paperwork have been inspected and approved for entry.

A. General Rules for All Animals: See M.G.L. c. 128 §2, 129 §2

- 1. All animals must be in proper physical condition, be properly identified and free of visual evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease at time of arrival. Specific diseases and conditions which will disqualify an animal for entry are identified for each species in the following sections of the rules. Animals of any species with open or draining wounds will not be approved for entry.
- **2.** Evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease or failure to produce the necessary documents for health certification, vaccination or testing will result in the animal's rejection for entry. **THE INSPECTOR'S DECISION IS FINAL**.
- **3.** Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only, and except for surgical procedures performed by aduly-licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

4. Official ID: See Final Rule: Summary of Traceability for Livestock Moved Interstate (Summary of general requirements by species)

All livestock must have proper official, individual ID as required and approved for the species, e.g., official metal ear tag, tattoo, scrapie tag, or microchip. Registration forms must accompany health certificates when used as part of official identification.

5. <u>Health Certificates: --</u>

One Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) may be allowed for animals of the same species to be exhibited at fairs or shows in any of the New England states (*CT, *ME, MA, **NH, RI, and ***VT) when submitted with an itinerary of the dates and locations of the events at which the listed animals are expected to be shown. Only animals that are healthy at the time of shipment may be moved. Note that *CT, *ME, **NH, and ***VT have additional requirements. Certificates of veterinary inspection in these states are valid for a shorter period of time and may have additional language, movement and permit requirements.

For the 2024 Show and Fair Season, livestock animals being exhibited in New England states must have official certificates of veterinary inspection (OCVIs) that meet the following requirements:

a. <u>MA</u> and RI: OCVIs issued on or after January 1, 2024 may be used for those animals being shown at multiple fairs and shows in MA, and RI through the 2024 show/fair season ending October 31, 2024.

MA -Notes: The Big E Fairgrounds in West Springfield requires an Infectious Disease Waiver (provided by The Big E) for all equines entering the premises for any show, fair, or exhibition. All Bovines must have official RFID tags.

- **b.** CT and ME: An importation permit for exhibition animals is also required. Contact CT Dept. of Agriculture (860-713-2504) or ME State Veterinarian's Office (207-287-3701) for permits or questions.
- c. NH: * * NH: To qualify for the extended CVI, animals exhibited in NH must originate in a New England state and move on OCVIs issued on or after April 1, 2024 to participating NH fairs and shows from July 1 to October 31. The extended CVI is not available for animals that do not reside in New England. Contact NH State Veterinarian's Office (603) 271-2404 for details and permits.
- **d.** ***VT: Contact the VT Animal Health Office (802-828-2421) for specific import requirements that deviate from the general information in this letter and must be met for legal import of livestock.
- **e.** A single OCVI from the animals' home state may be completed for travel to and from the New England states in which the animals will be exhibited. MA animals being shown ONLY in MA may substitute a signed, dated latter on the letterhead of an accredited veterinarian for an OCVI if all required information is included and all additional requirements are met.
- f. Multiple animals of the same species may be listed on one health certificate with appropriate individual IDs and descriptions. Animals of different species may not be listed on the same official health certificate.
- g. An itinerary of the names and locations for each New England fair or show at which owner expects to show the listed animals and the dates when each animal is expected to be on each site, must be prepared by the owner and presented to the veterinarian at the time the OCVI is written.
 - i. A copy of this planned itinerary must be attached to the official health certificate (import and export) for it to be used for more than one fair or show.
 - ii. That proposed list should be signed by the veterinarian and the owner/ exhibitor and reference the relevant OCVI number(s).
- **h.** The name and address of the first show or fair where the listed animals will be exhibited is to be used as the "destination" on the OCVI form. In addition, "See attached list" or a similar statement directing Animal Health Officials or Fair Inspectors to the attached proposed itinerary must be included.
- i. Exhibitors must keep an accurate list of the show locations and dates when their animals were actually on show/fair grounds. This record must be available to fair inspectors at each inspection and check-in.
- j. Any animal listed on an OCVI that becomes sick must remain home. If the animal is refused entry to any exhibition during 2024 for health reasons it must have a new health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of the next interstate movement.
- **k.** Any New England state may end their participation in this agreement and revert to the standard published requirements for livestock imports in the state at any time, in the event of foreign animal disease outbreak or changes to state legislation.

All petting zoos are required to have a USDA APHIS Exhibitor's License (as needed) and valid 2024 health certificates.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH SPECIES ARE LISTED BELOW

B. Cattle: See M.G.L. c. 129 §§2, 39 and 330 CMR 4.04(2).

- 1. TB and Brucellosis testing is not required for animals from TB-Accredited and Brucellosis-Free States and in-state animals. Current brucellosis and TB status in the exhibitor's state can be obtained from the state veterinarian's office in each state. If the exhibitor's state is not TB-Accredited or Brucellosis-Free, then the exhibitor must call the Massachusetts Division of Animal Health for entry requirements (617-626-1795 or 857-348-3922). All animals must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and conditions: foot rot, mange, pinkeye, ringworm, warts, cowpox and open or draining wounds.
- 2. While not required, it is strongly recommended that all cattle be currently vaccinated for rabies.
- 3. Note: The Big E is requiring RFID official identification tags for all cattle entering the Big E Fairgrounds premises in 2024. Other fairs may add this requirement. Contact fair office with questions.

SEE UPDATE ON FIRST PAGE OF 2024 ANIMAL HEALTH RULES FOR FAIRS AND SHOWS

C. Poultry: See M.G.L. c. §§2, 129, and 330 CMR 5.02.

- 1. No poultry will be admitted to a fairground until it has been individually inspected.
- 2. All poultry must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases: infectious bronchitis, coryza, pullorum-typhoid, fowl-pox, external parasites and laryngotracheitis.
- 3. Each bird must be accompanied by written proof (ID card or test report) that the breeding flock was blood-tested negative for pullorum-typhoid within one year prior to entry date.
- 4. Birds from quarantined states will not be permitted entry.
- 5. All birds over 16 weeks of age as of January 1, 2024 shall be individually leg banded with a state leg band. This includes out of state exhibitors.
- 6. No bird vaccinated for laryngotracheitis within thirty days of the fair will be admitted.

D. Goats: See M.G.L. c. 129 §2, 9 CFR 79.6 and Massachusetts Emergency Order 1-AHO-06

- 1. TB and Brucellosis testing is not required for animals from TB-Accredited and Brucellosis-Free States and in-state animals.
- 2. All goats and kids presented, regardless of age, must be individually listed and identified on the health certificate. All goats must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and conditions: foot rot, mange, pinkeye, ringworm, warts, pox and open or draining wounds. All goats must also be free of soremouth and scrapie exposure.
- 3. Based on the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program (FSEP), goats and sheep of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within state must possess a USDA official individual identification tag or registry tattoo accompanied by current registration papers

consistent with the requirements of the FSEP and the Massachusetts Emergency Order 1-AHO-06. Information is available from USDA-APHIS at 508-363- 2290.

E. Camelids (Llamas, Alpacas, etc.): See M.G.L. c. 129 §2, M.G. l. c. 131, §23,321 CMR 9.02.

- 1. TB and Brucellosis testing is not required for animals from TB-Accredited and Brucellosis-Free States and in-state animals. Current brucellosis and TB status in the exhibitor's state can be obtained from the state veterinarian's office in each state. If the exhibitor's state is not TB-Accredited or Brucellosis-Free, then the exhibitor must call the Massachusetts Division of Animal Health for entry requirements (617-626-1795 or 857-348-3922).
- 2. All Camelids originating from outside the Commonwealth are required to be tested for Blue Tongue. Exception: Animals from a USDA declared "Low Incident State" are exempt. New England and New York are low incident states.
- 3. All animals must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and conditions: foot rot, mange, pinkeye, ringworm, warts, pox and open or draining wounds.

F. Swine: See M.G.L. c. 129 §14E, 330 CMR 11.04(2), 9 CFR 71.19

- 1. All swine must be identified by an official ear tag or registration.
- 2. Swine must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and conditions: erysipelas, atrophic rhinitis, mange and open or draining wounds.
- 3. No person shall import into Massachusetts from outside the state any swine which have been pseudorabies vaccinated. M.G.L. c. 129 §14E.
- 4. No person shall import into Massachusetts swine from Stage I or Stage II Pseudorabies States.
- 5. All swine shall originate from qualified pseudorabies-free herds, or monitored herds in qualified pseudorabies free States only. The pseudorabies status of the exhibitor's state can be obtained from the state veterinarian's office in each state.

G. Sheep: See 9 CFR 79 and Massachusetts Emergency Order 1-AHO-06.

- 1. No sheep will be allowed entry from flocks in which Scrapie has been diagnosed or in which animals are under surveillance for Scrapie during the previous eighteen months. Based on the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program (FSEP), goats and sheep of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within state must possess a USDA official individual identification tag or registry tattoo accompanied by current registration papers consistent with the requirements of the FSEP and the Massachusetts Emergency Order 1-AHO-06. Information is available from USDA-APHIS at 508-363-2290.
- 2. No sheep will be permitted entry from flocks in which soremouth has existed or in which soremouth Vaccine has been administered in the previous sixty (60) days.
- 3. Sheep must be free from visual evidence of foot rot, sore mouth, pink eye, ringworm, and open and draining wounds. While not required, it is strongly recommended that sheep be currently vaccinated against rabies.

H. Equine: M.G.L. c. 128 §§2C, 44, 330 CMR 16.05.

- All equines entering a Massachusetts fairground must have a valid health certificate.
 Note: The Big E Fairgrounds in West Springfield requires for an Infectious Disease Waiver
 (provided by The Big E) signed by the exhibitor for all equines entering the premises for any
 show, fair, or exhibition.
- 2. All equines must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and conditions: mange, ringworm, soring, strangles, and open or draining wounds.
- 3. All equines originating from within and outside of the Commonwealth must have a negative USDA approved EIA test (i.e., Coggins test or ELISA test) dated within twelve months of entry.
- 4. While not required, it is *strongly recommended* that all equines be vaccinated for rabies, tetanus, EEE and WNV within one year of the fair.

I. Rabbits: See M.G.L. c. 129 §2

1. Rabbits must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases: rabbit hemorrhagic Disease Virus 2(RHDV2), snuffles, wet tail, and skin and ear infections. Microchips may be used for ID in rabbits originating in MA.

J. Dogs and Cats: See M.G.L. c. 129 §39G

- 1. All dogs and cats must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases: kennel cough, distemper, hepatitis, parvo, ringworm and mange.
- 2. All dogs and cats and those originating from out of this State must have a valid and current vaccination certificate for rabies.
